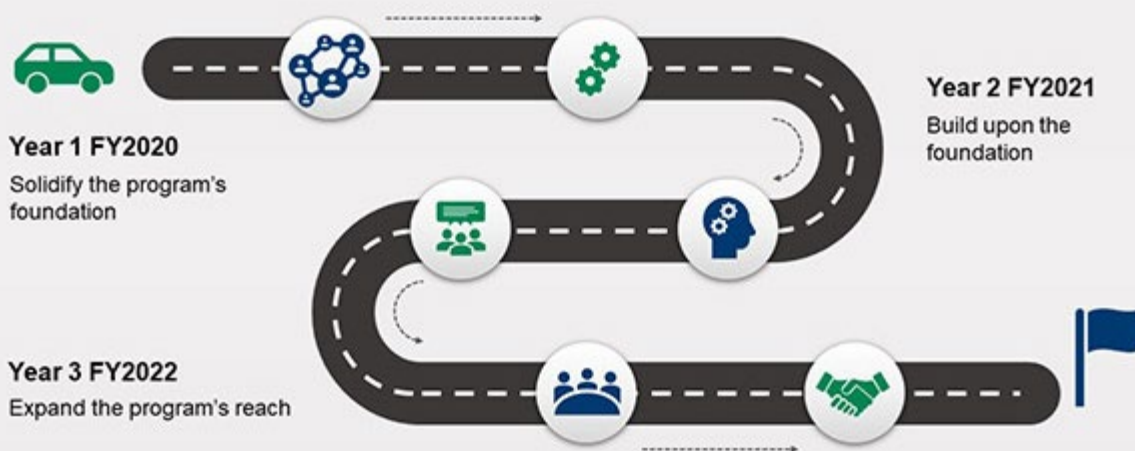

Wide World of Standards – Call for Participation

MedBiquitous will be participating in two new standards development projects from The IEEE Standards Association (IEEE SA). The first is the development of an [interoperable learner record](#). This project will create guidance on elements of learner records, including trust and verification, ontologies, and data payloads. The second is the [common model for learning technology systems](#). This guide will provide a conceptual model and classification of data used by **ALL** learning technology systems.
